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<b>Executive Summary</b>	
<p>The "Inaugural session" was addressed by "Prof. Nandana Datta of Gauhati University's Department of English". She also stated that within a discipline, ethical issues can arise. We must address the critical fundamental issue of epistemology, or knowledge theory, which has three basic questions: who studies, what is studied, and how it is studied. Responsibility, conflict of interest, confidentiality, anonymity, and, most importantly, informed consent are all ethical issues that must be addressed. Aside from that, there are other critical issues relating to epistemological foundations. Speaking about something one knows rather than copying and pasting it is an example of ethical behaviour. She emphasised why ethical concerns are so important today. According to her, there is a growing emphasis on multidisciplinary ethical concerns.</p> <p>The presentation on "Aspects of Content Writing" by "Lopamudra Baruah Principal Researcher, Gaertner" was enthralling and precise. The first session covered what content is, the second covered the do's and don'ts of content writing, and the final session covered some examples of content writing. The ingredients that make the platter of content writing precise, good, and reader-friendly are the focus areas while writing. The second section discusses what to avoid when writing, and the third discusses best practices for improving writing skills.</p> <p>The session on "Journal Selection for Publication" was led by "Dr. Amarjyoti Mahanta, Associate Professor, Department of Economics, Dibrugarh University". The highlight of the session was his two-part presentation on the Fundamentals of Research Paper Preparation and Publication. The first section was primarily concerned with the preparation of a research paper. In his deliberation, Dr. Mahanta emphasised that a research paper is a scientific effort to find a solution to a research problem and adds to the existing body of knowledge through specific procedures.</p> <p>The session on "Research and Publication Ethics" was led by "Dr. Sabina Yesmin of Krea University's LEAD". She started her session by asking a broad question about our ethical standing. She talked about the learning objectives of recognising ethical issues in publishing and emphasised the importance of using existing resources and guidelines. She also mentioned the various platforms through which the information can be disseminated. She discussed research transparency and scientific ethics. She provided a publication checklist that includes Approval and Consent, Data Accuracy, and Plagiarism.</p> <p>"Prof. Kavish Gupta of the Department of Economics of University of Calcutta" led the discussion "Writing Research Papers for Conferences and Journals". He went over the</p>	
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<p>elements of a good research paper as well as the do's and don'ts of research paper writing. He also emphasised the importance of choosing the right journal for our publications and following the journal's norms and guidelines.</p> <p>"<i>On Text Book Writing: Author's Perspective</i>", "<i>Dr. Savitri Priyadarshini of the Department of Economics at D.C.B Girls' College in Jorhat</i>" served as a resource person. She coherently presented her author's point of view in two parts. The first is the process of writing a textbook, and the second is the ethical issues that arise as a result of that process. She emphasised the importance of paying attention to the intended audience when writing a book in the first part of her presentation and discussion. Aside from that, one must identify the materials needed for the book writing process and then organise and index them systematically. In the second half of her presentation, Dr. Priyadarshini discussed the ethical responsibility of a textbook writer. She believes that the writer should be capable of explaining the relevant subject while maintaining quality.</p> <p>The session on "<i>Creative Writing for Newspapers</i>" was presided over by "<i>Dr. Girish Chandra Baruah, Retd HoD and Author, Department of Philosophy, DED College, Dergau</i>". Dr. Baruah demonstrated different types of newspaper writing, such as reporting, editorial or column writing, and other forms of creative writing, such as novels, short stories, poems, and critical writing, such as article writing. "The essence of writing is that we want to inform something and disseminate information," Dr. Baruah continued. As a result, imagination is essential in creative writing. He believes that writing should be engaging, thought-provoking, and reader-friendly, as well as add value to the reader's mental faculty.</p> <p>The session on "<i>Philosophy, Ethics, and Scientific Conduct in Research</i>" was led by "<i>Dr. Jahnabi Deka, Assistant Professor, Department of Philosophy at Gauhati University</i>". The primary focus, however, was on scientific conduct, which she considers to be the responsibility of researchers and academics. She believes that all researchers are philosophers in some way. She connected all three aspects of research and traced it back to philosophy and ethics because every researcher begins with a grasp of the subject's philosophy. She concluded that the need for research ethics arises as a result of the need to adhere to moral principles that govern a person's behaviour or the conduct of research activity, i.e., to conduct research scientifically.</p> <p>"<i>Dr. Anupam Chanda, Librarian, Bahona College</i>" delivered an in-depth and informative presentation on the various software tools for checking similarity indexes and how to use them. He explained why these tools are necessary for determining the similarity index. His presentation was broken down into sections that covered topics ranging from plagiarism to</p>	
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<p>grammar-checking software. However, these free tools should not be used excessively or relied on. He believes that these should only be used to supplement our knowledge.</p> <p><i>"Dr. Manoj Kumar Verma Associate Professor, Department Library &amp; Information Science, Mizoram University"</i> discussed "Bibliographical Databases and Research Metrics". His talk was divided into two parts. He discussed the bibliography in the first half of his presentation, which he defined as a list of sources used to write about a topic. In the second half of his presentation, he discussed research metrics. According to Dr. Verma, research metrics are used to calculate the performance of a study. Based on the citation index and journal impact factor, he believes it is used to quantify the impact of a scholarly work. In his closing remarks, he stated that researchers must carefully consider all of this and make appropriate publications.</p> <p><i>"Ms. Atanukrita Mahendra, Publication Manager, Higher Education – South Asia Cambridge University Press"</i> discussed her experience with "Text Book Publication". She walked the audience through the textbook publishing process, which she described as a collaborative effort involving authors, reviewers, editors, and a slew of people working behind the scenes to make a book a reality. Ms. Mahendra believes that when reviewing manuscripts, reputable publishing houses look for originality. The content must be authentic, and if something from another source in the academic vertical is used, proper credit must be given. Licenses must be signed in addition to acknowledging the sources. In her closing remarks, Ms. Mahendra emphasised the importance of using extreme caution when writing and printing in an ethnically diverse environment. She also emphasised the importance of upgrading to reach a larger audience and attract more buyers.</p> <p><i>"Prof. Madhurya Prasad Bebarua, Professor Department of Economics, Gauhati University"</i> began his presentation "Application, Research, and Project Submission" by describing the Life Cycle of a Research Proposal, which is divided into three major parts: proposal formulation, research execution, and dissemination. He also discussed the Extensive Detailing of Research Proposal Components. He organised the design by emphasising the seven elements of a research proposal. Prof. Bebarua also discussed the Timeline and Budget. Prof. Bebarua believes that perseverance and pain are essential components of research. The goal of research is to advance and broaden knowledge's frontier. To stay in the game, one must constantly improve.</p> <p><i>"Dr. Murgan Parusamy Assistant Professor, School of Management Studies University of Hyderabad"</i> discussed "Open Access and Creative License" extensively. He stated that research is extremely important in academia. However, as a researcher, one must disseminate knowledge because it has policy implications. As a result, it is critical to consider ethical issues</p>	
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<p>when conducting research. He emphasised the importance of Open Access Publishing in the conduct of high-quality research. He explained that Open Access Publication digital, or online information, is typically free with less restrictive copyright and licensing barriers. He described the various types of creative licensing and their characteristics. He discussed predatory publishers and journals, as well as the red flags to look for to identify them.</p> <p>The "Valedictory Session" was presided over by "Rabindra Nath Kalia, Rd. IAS". He summarised the importance of ethics in our daily lives, particularly in research and academic publishing. He explained why ethics is so important in all aspects of life. And how, in research and publication, one must exercise caution and adhere to ethical principles.</p>	
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


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
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<b>ICSSR sponsored Multidisciplinary National Seminar on Understanding National Education Policy-2020: Issues and Challenges</b>	



The Academic Development Cell, IQAC, Bahona College has conducted a National Seminar on "Understanding National Education Policy (NEP)-2020: Issues and Challenges" on 21<sup>st</sup> & 22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2023. The Objectives of the Seminar is to provide a platform for an open discussion about the shifting paradigm of education policy and particularly Challenges and opportunities of Higher Educational Institutions, to have a discussion about the role and function of educationists, teacher educators and teachers in the implementation of NEP 2020 in its true spirit and nature, to have a discussion about effect of NEP on Youth Development and sports development, to highlight the issues like- role of ICT Education and skill based education and to throw light on the need and significance of higher education and policy. Seminar included distinguished Guest of Honour, keynote speaker and Special Guests. Total number of 104 participants attended in this Seminar.

There were three sessions, First session was inaugural session. This session was hosted by Dr. Mridul Dutta, Convener of the Seminar. 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<b>ICSSR sponsored Multidisciplinary National Seminar on Understanding National Education Policy-2020: Issues and Challenges</b>	

Prof Jiten Hazarika, Vice Chancellor of Dibrugarh University, delivered the Inaugural Address. He stated in his speech that rather than understanding the aspects of NEP, now is the time to implement NEP. As a result, in this context, it is necessary to understand what the implementation challenges are and how to overcome them. He stated in his speech that Dibrugarh University has already developed curriculum and is ready to implement the NEP in the colleges. His speech focused on the implementation process in the 64 colleges affiliated with Dibrugarh University. He went on to say that the NEP's vision is to make India a knowledge superpower, or a *Vishwa Guru*. However, teachers must change their perspective and think like a learner rather than an expert. He stated that education should not be broad in scope. During his speech, he also talked about the NEP curriculum framework and how it differs from the previous curriculum. He concluded that instead of creating job seekers, seminars should disseminate knowledge and education institutes should create more opportunities for developing entrepreneurship skills.

Dr. Shaswati Choudhury, OKDISC, delivered the Keynote Address. She talked about how NEP came to be. She also discussed the challenges that must be addressed, as well as the strategies required to do so. She emphasised the importance of the NEP in the changing global economy and job market. She went on to say that the NEP, which emphasises critical thinking and a shift away from traditional educational structures, is in line with the SDGs. Hands-on learning is required for this to improve capabilities and skills. In addition, she stated that innovation is critical for holistic education and that the NEP Academic Setup proposes to remove barriers. As a result, the NEP proposes a change in pedagogical structure. She believes that strict division limits students, whereas flexibility allows them to pursue their interests. It emphasises language and the introduction of a medium of instruction in their mother tongue, as well as sports. The states must select their indigenous languages. However, in a multilingual state, this is a problem.

The Guest of Honour, Prof. Joydeep Baruah, Director, SKBSSS, KKHSOU addressed the participants about the various issues and aspects of NEP. He emphasised the importance of change in India and how the mindset of teachers and society as a whole must change. Students should have options, and the decision should be based on the opportunity to learn and reflect. The necessary skill sets must be developed. The teaching method must be altered. This necessitates the

College, Bimal Chandra Bora, spoke about previous policies and how NEP differs from previous education policies. He defined it as experiential, discovery-oriented, learner-centered, and enjoyable learning, and he explained why it is necessary. He also discussed how the NEP intends to prepare students for rational thought and action. In his talk, he also discussed how to materialize/achieve these goals, which necessitate complete institutional restructuring and consolidation.</p> <p><b>Technical Session-I, II</b></p> <p>Dr Soumitra Puzari of Jorhat College presided over the technical session I. The session featured 11 (Eleven) papers. The papers presented in the session covered a wide range of topics, including hearing impairment, the impact of NEP on single-stream colleges, teacher education, the Indian Knowledge System, and inclusive education. The resource person and the house took part in the discussion and offered suggestions to the paper presenters on how to improve their papers. The most important aspects to be taken care of are to develop logical and critical thinking in students from elementary level and develop technology literacy among the teachers. Also, incorporating indigenous games and local art-forms in education is a challenge as well as an opportunity for the teachers to be given emphasis on. The policy begins with no barrier of stream (Science-Arts-Commerce) and emphasizes equality in learning for all. In the session there has been an open discussion with the school representatives including headmasters, CEEC members, and teachers about how differently they are including and incorporating the policy's aspects in their respective schools.

Technical Session IV was chaired by Dr.Banu Dey of the DU Department of Political Science. The session featured 12 (Twelve) papers. . The papers presented in the session covered a wide range of topics, including managing resource allocation for catalyzing research and innovation, integration of technology in Educational pedagogy and so on. He stated in his initial remark that the government changes the Education Policy on a regular basis, and this policy is no exception. But first, we must understand the ideology that underpins the policies. In terms of delivery, regulation, and finance, there has been a significant shift in policy primary to secondary to HEIs. As a result, there will be debate and deliberation in a variety of forums. And, on the eve of its implementation, the Seminar will be useful in disseminating knowledge.

The papers presented focused on how the NEP will allegedly pave the way for digital learning in rural areas, where the majority of students come from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. During the session, it was also discussed how the NEP's emphasis on skill development will lead to increased employability. Aside from the introduction of self-paced learning, the barriers to NEP implementation were also discussed. The NEP's emphasis on improving the quality of interpersonal relationships between students, teachers, and parents, as well as minimising adolescent behaviour and emotional problems, were also discussed. Furthermore, the importance of NEP in both academics and sports was discussed.
